Fire-Safe Cigarette Passes First Test in Senate

Senate Bill 08-026, Concerning a Requirement that Cigarettes Sold in Colorado Meet Specified Standards for Reduced Ignition Propensity (Sen. Hagedorn, Rep. White) was heard by Senate Health and Human Services Committee on January 23, 2008 and witness testimony was taken. The bill was taken off the table and laid over until Wednesday, January 30th for amendments by the Sponsor.

The only two people to testify were Dave Nuss of NFPA and CSFCA Executive Director Paul Cooke. Nuss discussed the national impact of cigarette-caused fires and discussed what RIP cigarettes are. Cooke testified on the state impact of cigarette-caused fires and the CSFCA goal to reduce the state's fire problem. The bill sponsor briefed the committee on the work that he had done to get all stakeholders on board with this bill, but indicated that amendments were necessary to address concerns raised by the Department of Revenue.

The CSFCA sought to amend the bill to expand the uses of the "Reduced Cigarette Ignition Propensity Standards and Firefighter Protection Act Enforcement Fund" created from fees and penalties. Under the bill as introduced, fund proceeds and penalties may only be used for the administration and enforcement of the Act. The proposed amendment would permit all fees and penalties collected in excess of those needed for the administration and enforcement of the Act to be used for fire safety and prevention programs, including firefighter training and certification.

On January 30th the bill was amended by the Senate Health and Human Services Committee to include the language sought by the CSFCA. The bill was then passed to Senate Appropriations Committee on a 4-2 vote, with one absent.

School Building & Fire Safety Bill Advances

House Bill 08-1027, Concerning Building Inspection Requirements for Educational Institutions (Rep. Mitchell V., Sen. Taylor) was heard by House Education Committee on January 24, 2008. CSFCA President Forsman; Rob Geislinger, Fire Marshal of Parker and President of the Fire Marshals Association of Colorado (FMAC); Jerry Stricker, Fire Marshal of Golden; and Paul Cooke, CSFCA Executive Director were all in attendance at the hearing.

HB08-1027 is a Legislative Audit Committee bill in response to the State Auditor's Performance Audit of the Division of Oil and Public Safety, which was released on June 11, 2007. The audit identified significant concerns about the value of the Public School Construction Program and the Division's ability to ensure the safety of the children and adults who occupy these schools.

HB08-1027 clarifies the role of the Division of Oil and Public Safety in delegating the responsibility of performing inspections of public school buildings to a building department or a 3rd-party inspector. An amendment was authored by the School Safety Stakeholder Group, which included representation from the CSFCA, FMAC, ICC, schools, and the affected state agencies, to clarify the roles and authorities of the Division of Fire Safety and local fire departments with respect to fire code issues.

Basic Provisions of House Education Committee Amendment to HB08-1027

As it relates to building plans and construction inspections, Amendment C.001 to HB08-1027:

- Requires copies of building plans be sent to the local fire department and the Division of Fire Safety, and requires the Division of Fire Safety to track and monitor the status of all building plans that have been referred to the local fire department.
- If the fire department declines to perform the plan review or any subsequent inspection, or if no certified fire inspector is available, the Division of Fire Safety shall perform the plan review or inspection.

As it relates to maintenance (fire code) inspections, Amendment C.001 to HB08-1027:

- Allows the local fire department to inspect schools for compliance with fire code adopted by the Division of Oil and Public Safety (does not require the fire department to have certified inspectors). If the local fire department does not perform the authorized inspections, the Division of Fire Safety has the authority and duty to conduct them.
- Provides that a local fire department may refer notices of deficiencies to the Division of Fire Safety for evaluation or enforcement.
- Maintains the authority of local fire departments (and, in the case of municipal departments, grants the authority) to correct violations that pose an immediate threat to life safety and seek enforcement action in court.

Jerry Stricker testified in House Education Committee on behalf of both FMAC and CSFCA in support of the stakeholder group amendment and passage of the bill. The amendment was offered and passed, and the bill passed unanimously, as amended to Appropriations Committee.

Bill to Create Training Program for Fire District Directors Stalls

Senate Bill 08-039, Concerning a Training Program for Directors of Fire Protection Districts in Wildland-Urban Interface Areas (Sen. Kopp, Rep. Witwer) was heard by Senate Local Government Committee on January 24, 2008. SB-039 would direct the Division of Fire Safety to establish a pilot program to offer training courses to board members of fire protection districts whose territory includes wildland-urban interface areas.

The bill also specifies that the course subjects shall include: strategic planning; the roles, responsibilities, and fiduciary duties of board members of fire protection districts; human resource management; and community outreach on wildland-urban interface issues.

Chief Tom Kennelly of Elk Creek Fire Protection District (and constituent of the bills sponsor) testified on behalf of the CSFCA. Chief Kennelly testified on the need for this type of training, especially that related to wildland-urban interface issues. He indicated the support of the Colorado State Fire Chiefs' Association for the bill, so long as the training is not mandated and the Division of Fire Safety is adequately resourced to provide it.

An amendment was offered to address the concern raised by the Special District's Association (SDA) that some of the training called for in the bill was already provided by them – specifically the human resource management, board member responsibilities and fiduciary responsibilities.

However, the Division of Fire Safety was not represented at the hearing to answer questions about their ability and desire to take on this program. This, coupled with the fact that the bill had a \$12,500 GF fiscal note, led Sen. Kopp to request that the bill be taken off the table for consideration. It will be rescheduled for action when these issues are resolved.

Tax Deduction for Wildland Fire Mitigation Passes House Committee

House Bill 08-1110, Concerning an Income Tax Deduction For a Landowner's Direct Costs Incurred in Performing Wildfire Mitigation Measures (Rep. Witwer, Sen. Kopp) was heard by House Finance Committee on January 24, 2008. HB-1110 would offer a state income tax deduction of 50 percent of a homeowner's costs performing up to \$2,500 of wildfire mitigation or a tax deduction totaling the property owner's federal taxable income, whichever is less. The wildland mitigation measures must be performed on private land in a wildland-urban interface area with a community wildfire protection plan.

While presenting HB-1110, Rep. Witwer, said "Colorado's version of Hurricane Katrina very well could be a catastrophic wildfire." He added that "One well-treated community may well stop a wildfire in its tracks."

Chief Nick Lauria of the Northeast Teller County Fire Protection District testified on behalf of the CSFCA on the bill. Chief Lauria discussed the need for mitigation and the value of providing incentives to homeowners. He pointed out that many WUI areas "are economically depressed, or at least marginalized, and mitigation can be costly."

Steve Lynn, Wildfire Mitigation Specialist with Boulder Mountain Fire discussed what a Community Wildfire Protection Plan is and how they are developed. Christina Randall, Wildland Risk Manager with the Colorado Springs Fire Department discussed their wildland fire mitigation program noting that "people respond to different types of motivation, and this bill provides one motivation."

She also testified that, according to FEMA, every dollar spent on mitigation saves four dollars in fire suppression costs.

Chris Barth, also with the Colorado Springs Fire Department, discussed their FireWise Program and their partnership with the community, urging residents to "share in the responsibility."

Bill Easterling, Fire Marshal/Administrator of Genesee Fire & Rescue wrapped up the testimony by answering some of the questions raised by members of the Committee and indicated that if nothing else, that passing the bill would be "sending a message to the people of Colorado that this is an important issue."

John Singer of the Colorado State Fire Fighters Association went on record in support of the bill, and Chief Tom Kennelly of Elk Creek Fire Protection District was in the audience in a show of support.

HB-1110 was passed to House Appropriations Committee, with amendments, on a 7-3 vote, with 1 excused. Voting for the bill were Representatives Benefield, Borodkin, Frangas, Kerr, Labuda, Lambert, and Lunberg. Voting against were Representatives Bruce, Garcia and Judd.

Status of Bills of Interest

We are 27 days into the legislative session and so far, a total of 460 bills have been introduced. Of these, a total of 25 have implications on the Colorado fire service and are being actively monitored by the Association. This update highlights several bills of interest to the Colorado fire service. A summary of all bills the CSFCA is tracking, their status, and the Association position is included.

SB08-001, Concerning Creation of a School Safety Resource Center within the Department of Public Safety. (Sen. Morse, Rep. Stephens)

Summary: Creates in the department of public safety the school safety resource center to assist schools in preventing, preparing for, responding to, and recovering from emergencies and crisis situations. Sets forth the duties of the center. Authorizes the center to employ staff and contract for services.

Status: 01/23/2008 Senate Committee on Education - Refer Unamended to Judiciary

SB-001 is scheduled to be heard by Senate Judiciary Committee on Wednesday, February 6, 2008 at 1:30 P.M. SCR 352.

CSFCA Position: Monitor; seek an amendment to include a fire chief on the advisory board.

SB08-009, Concerning Measures to Ensure the Proper Payment of Fire and Police Pension Benefits. (Sen. Tochtrop, Rep. Rice)

Summary: Establishes penalties related to fire and police pension death and disability survivor benefits for a member who, as otherwise required by law, fails to submit to a medical examination or fails to provide information to the board of directors of the fire and police pension association or its designee.

Status: 01/31/2008 Senate Local Government Committee – Pass to Committee of the Whole

CSFCA Position: Monitor

SB08-011, Concerning Funding for the Provision of Uncompensated Trauma Care to Persons Injured in Motor Vehicle Accidents in Colorado. (Sen. Morse, Rep. Massey)

Summary: Establishes the emergency responders and trauma care reimbursement program in the department of public health and environment to reimburse emergency and trauma care providers for uncompensated care provided to patients injured in a motor vehicle accident. Allows reimbursements for uncompensated trauma care to licensed ambulances, licensed air ambulances, trauma physicians, and trauma centers that satisfy specified criteria, and prioritizes reimbursement payments first to the ambulances, second to the trauma physicians, third to level III, IV, and V trauma centers located in rural areas, and fourth to all other trauma centers.

Status: 01/9/2008 Introduced In Senate – Assigned to Health and Human Services

CSFCA Position: Support

SB08-026, Concerning a Requirement that Cigarettes Sold in Colorado Meet Specified Standards for Reduced Ignition Propensity. (Sen. Hagedorn)

Summary: Requires all cigarettes sold in Colorado on or after July 31, 2009, to be tested for, and to meet, specified standards for reduced ignition propensity. Specifies labeling to identify complying cigarettes. Prescribes the testing methods to be used. Requires manufacturers to certify in writing that their cigarettes have been tested and meet the standards.

Status: 01/30/2008 Senate Health and Human Services Comm. Refer Amended to Appropriations.

CSFCA Position: Support

SB08-039; Concerning a Training Program for Directors of Fire Protection Districts in Wild Land-Urban Interface Areas. (Sen. Kopp, Rep. Witwer)

Summary: Directs the division of fire safety in the department of public safety to establish a

pilot program by a specified date to offer training courses to board members of fire protection districts whose territory includes wildland-urban interface areas.

Status: 01/24/2008 Senate Local Government Committee Lay Over Unamended

CSFCA Position: Amend & Support

SB08-051, Concerning a Grant of Additional Enforcement Authority to the Director of the Division of Oil and Public Safety. (Sen. Taylor, Rep. Marshall)

Summary: Grants enforcement authority to the director of the division of oil and public safety (division) in the department of labor and employment for violations of laws and rules concerning boilers and explosives. Allows the director to seek an injunction restraining a person from violating laws or rules concerning public school construction, boilers, and explosives. Allows the division to inspect blast sites. Requires an entity that conducts blasting to notify the division.

Status: 01/14/2008 Introduced In Senate - Assigned to Business, Labor and Technology

SB-051 is scheduled to be heard by Senate Business, Labor, & Technology Committee on Tuesday, February 5, 2008 – upon Adjournment in SCR 354.

CSFCA Position: Monitor

SB08-071, Concerning Extension of the Repeal Date of the Forest Restoration Pilot Program, and, in Connection Therewith, Extending the Repeal Date of the Technical Advisory Panel. (Sen. Gibbs, Rep. Scanlan)

Summary: Extends the repeal date for the forest restoration pilot program and the technical advisory panel to July 1, 2012.

Status: 01/31/2008 Committee on Agriculture, Natural Resources & Energy Refer Amended to Appropriations

CSFCA Position: Support

SB08-080, Concerning an Income Tax Credit for Volunteer Firefighters (Sen. Kopp, Rep. Witwer)

Summary: For income tax years commencing on or after January 1, 2008, but prior to January 1, 2018, there shall be allowed a credit with respect to the income taxes imposed pursuant to the provisions of this article in the amount of \$125 per income tax year to any qualified volunteer firefighter.

Status: 01/16/2008 Introduced In Senate - Assigned to Finance + Appropriations

CSFCA Position: Amend & Support

Note: Sen. Kopp advised that he would have to PI this bill as it is a revenue reduction bill and must start in the House. Rep. Witwer has late-bill status and will run it in the House.

SB08-103, Concerning a Requirement that a Portion of the Property Tax Revenues Collected by an Urban Renewal Authority In Connection With Tax Increment Financing be Shared with Other Local Governments. (Sen. Tochtrop)

Summary: Commencing with the first property tax year in which any payment of property taxes are allocated and paid into a special fund to pay off indebtedness incurred by an urban renewal project, requires an urban renewal authority to make an annual payment to the other public bodies that share in the revenues produced by the property tax levy, including counties, school districts, and special districts, in an amount that is not less than a specified percentage of the amount of revenues from the property tax levy paid into the special fund in that year.

Status: 01/29/2008 Introduced In Senate - Assigned to Local Government

CSFCA Position: Monitor

SB08-116, Concerning a Requirement that Employers of a Specified Size Allow Employees Who Are Volunteer Firefighters to Leave Work to Respond to an Emergency Summons. (Sen. Kester, Rep. Looper)

Summary: Protects the jobs of employees who leave work to respond to specified emergency summonses as volunteer firefighters when the employer employs more than 50 employees, has been notified previously of the employee's status as a trained and certified volunteer firefighter, and receives written verification that the employee so responded.

Status: 01/30/2008 Introduced In Senate - Assigned to Local Government

CSFCA Position: Amend & Support

.....

HB08-1009, Concerning Emergency Medical Care Coverage in Connection With an Automobile Insurance Policy Issued in Colorado. (Rep. Massey, Sen. Morse)

Summary: Requires an automobile insurance policy issued, delivered, or renewed on or after January 1, 2009, to contain emergency medical care coverage of at least \$15,000 to cover the costs of all medically necessary and policy. Preserves the right of the insurer to offer, and the insured to purchase, emergency medical care coverage in excess of the minimum coverage required by law.

Status: 01/9/2008 Introduced In House - Assigned to Business Affairs and Labor

CSFCA Position: Monitor

HB08-1027, Concerning Building Inspection Requirements for Educational Institutions. (Rep. Mitchell V., Sen. Taylor)

Summary: Clarifies the role of the division of oil and public safety in delegating the responsibility of performing inspections of public school buildings and junior college district buildings to a building department or a

3rd-party inspector. Requires a memorandum of understanding between the division and a building department that wishes to perform inspections. Repeals the limit on the fee that the division may charge to perform an inspection and the requirement that the fee be mandatory. Grants rule-making authority to the director of the division to implement the program.

Status: 01/24/2008 House Committee on Education Refer Amended to House Appropriations

CSFCA Position: Support as amended by House Education Committee

HB08-1070, Concerning the Redetermination of Benefits Payable Under the FPPA's Statewide Defined Benefit Plan for New Hire Members. (Rep. Riesberg, Sen. Tochtrop)

Summary: Modifies how the board of directors of the fire and police pension association may increase the benefits payable under statewide defined benefit plans for members of the association hired on or after April 8, 1978.

Status: 01/31/2008 Senate Local Government Committee Pass Unamended to Senate Committee of the Whole

CSFCA Position: Monitor

.....
HB08-1097, Concerning the Provision of Protections to Certain Types of Volunteers Who Volunteer Their Services in a State-Level Emergency Situation. (Rep. Lambert, Sen Romer)

Summary: Prohibits any employer from discriminating against or discharging from employment any member of the civil air patrol because of such membership and from preventing any member from performing a civil air patrol mission. Allows a member who is a public employee and who is called to duty for a civil air patrol mission to take a leave of

absence from his or her employment without loss of pay or benefits during the period of the mission.

Status: 01/31/2008 House Committee on State, Veterans, & Military Affairs Witness Testimony Only

Note: The sponsor introduced an amendment during the committee hearing on 1/31/08 that would expand the bill to cover all volunteers (Amendment L.001). The amendment has issues that need to be worked out.

The bill was laid over until Thursday, February 7, 2008 – upon recess in Room 0112.

CSFCA Position: No position on bill; amend the amendment.

HB08-1103, Concerning the Regulation of Amusement Rides by the Division of Oil and Public Safety. (Rep. Kerr, J. and Sen. Isgar)

Summary: Requires each operator of an amusement ride to submit an annual certificate of inspection to the division of oil and public safety for each amusement ride. Requires the director of the division to establish minimum certification requirements for inspectors. Requires the inspector of each ride to be an independent 3rd-party inspector. Requires the operator of an amusement ride to notify the division regarding injuries caused by amusement rides, the installation of new rides, and the schedule for the location of amusement rides.

Status: 01/31/2008 House Committee on Business Affairs and Labor - Refer Amended to Appropriations

CSFCA Position: Monitor

HB08-1110, Concerning an Income Tax Deduction for a Landowner's Direct Costs Incurred in Performing Wildfire Mitigation Measures. (Rep. Witwer, Sen. Kopp)

Summary: Allows an income tax deduction for a landowner who performs wildfire mitigation measures on private land in a wild land-urban interface area.

Status: 01/30/2008 House Committee on Finance Refer Amended to Appropriations

CSFCA Position: Support

HB08-1163, Concerning an Exception to Statutory Requirements Governing the Collection of Excess Property Tax Revenue by Urban Renewal Authorities in Connection With Tax Increment Financing for Certain Special Districts Providing Emergency Services. (Rep. Sonnenberg, Sen. Bacon)

Summary: Commencing with the first property tax year in which the excess of any payment of property taxes is allocated and paid into a special fund on or after the effective date of the act in connection with tax increment financing by urban renewal authorities, prohibits any portion of any revenues from such excess that are allocated to any special district providing emergency services, including without limitation ambulance districts, fire protection districts, and certain metropolitan districts, from being collected and paid into the special fund. In such cases, specifies that all revenues collected from the excess of any payment of property taxes shall be distributed to the special districts providing emergency services as if there were no requirement to pay the excess into a special fund.

Status: 01/16/2008 Introduced In House - Assigned to Finance

HB-1163 is scheduled to be heard by House Finance Committee on Tuesday, February 5, 2008 - upon recess in Room LSB-A.

CSFCA Position: Amend & Support

Note: CSFCA will support an amendment that will make it permissive for an emergency services district to participate in TIF or Urban Renewal Authorities.

HB08-1187, Concerning the Prohibition of Strikes Against Public Employers. (Rep. B. Gardner, Sen. Spence)

Summary: Prohibits every public employee and every employee organization from directly or indirectly inducing, instigating, encouraging, authorizing, ratifying, or participating in a strike against any public employer. Prohibits a public employer from consenting to or condoning a strike. In the event of a public employee strike or the imminent threat of a strike, authorizes the public employer to seek an injunction from the district court.

Status: 01/24/2008 House Committee on Business Affairs and Labor Postpone Indefinitely

CSFCA Position: Monitor

.....
HB08-1249, Concerning the Emergency Telephone Services Charge. (Rep. Rice, Sen. Kester)

Summary: Clarifies that the 911 service charge applies to prepaid wireless and internet-based telephone systems. Sets standards for the collection of such service charge. Changes the timing of the distribution of 911 service fees to any time a service user is capable of accessing the emergency service. Directs the public utilities commission to promulgate rules governing the remittance of 911 service fees to governing bodies based on point of sale, area of primary usage, customer address, or other relevant methods.

Makes a prepaid wireless service supplier liable for any unpaid service charge. Authorizes a governing body to specify when the 911 charge may be paid. Narrows the service supplier's limitation of liability for unpaid charges to those charges that have been billed to the service user.

Status: 01/30/2008 Introduced In House - Assigned to Transportation & Energy

CSFCA Position: Monitor

HB08-1251, Concerning Hazardous Material Route Designations. (Rep. Curry)

Summary: Enables a county to petition for changes to a hazardous material route designation with respect to any portion of a state- or county-maintained public road located within that county. Requires any entity petitioning for a route designation change to identify any alternate routes in its petition. Mandates that such alternate routes will be presumed viable unless clear and convincing evidence to the contrary is established. Specifies that unapproved and necessary deviations to designated routes, for the purposes of servicing a motor vehicle delivering or picking up hazardous materials, must occur wholly within the restricted route.

Status: 01/30/2008 Introduced In House - Assigned to Transportation & Energy

CSFCA Position: Monitor

HB08-1279, Concerning Governmental Land Use Regulations, and, in Connection Therewith, Requiring Land Developers to Pay Fees to Address the Impacts Caused By New Construction, Placing Limits on Fees For Changes in Permitted Uses of Real Property, Prohibiting the New Issuance or Application of Land Use Regulations in Specified Circumstances Without the Payment of Just Compensation, and Providing for Initiative Petition Rights by Which Electors May Vote to Limit or End Land Use Regulations. (Rep. Bruce)

Summary: Requires each land developer seeking to develop Colorado real property for new construction, but not for additions to existing structures, to pay, within a specified deadline after final plat approval or similar final approvals, a proportionate impact fee in an amount established by a public schedule related to the direct and indirect impacts of such development as specified in the act.

Requires each local board to review and update annually any existing impact fees.

Under specified circumstances, authorizes the local board to receive payment of impact fees in land instead of a monetary payment as long as the value of any land offered is within a specified percentage of the equivalent monetary amount, considering factors specified in the act.

On or after the effective date of the act, prohibits any local government, even with voter approval, from increasing taxes or issuing bonds, certificates of participation, leases, or any other legal borrowing instruments to finance new or expanded capital improvements that address growth caused by new construction for which impact fees under the act are being paid or will be paid to the local government. [more, see bill]

Status: 01/31/2008 Introduced In House - Assigned to Local Government

HB 08-1315, Concerning the Authorization for Volunteer Emergency Medical Technicians to Form a Pension Plan. (Rep. Gallegos)

Summary: Expands the "Volunteer Firefighter Pension Act" to allow volunteer emergency medical technicians (EMTs) who are affiliated with an ambulance district to create and maintain a pension plan for volunteer EMTs.

Specifies that the state shall provide a contribution to each volunteer EMT pension plan in an amount equal to a certain percentage of the tax revenue that the ambulance district receives for the plan.

Provides certain job protections for volunteer EMTs. Specifies that a volunteer EMT's years of service for the purposes of receiving benefits shall be counted from the date that a volunteer EMT pension plan is created and starts receiving contributions.

Status: 02/01/2008 Introduced In House - Assigned to Local Government

Recommended Position: Monitor.

HB08-1324, Concerning an Income Tax Credit for Volunteer Firefighters. (Witwer, Kopp)

For income tax years commencing on or after January 1, 2008, but prior to January 1, 2018, there shall be allowed a credit with respect to the income taxes imposed pursuant to the provisions of this article in the amount of \$125 per income tax year to any qualified volunteer firefighter.

Note: This bill replaces SB08-080 by the same title and sponsors, as because revenue reduction bills must start in the House.

Status: 02/04/2008 Introduced In House - Assigned to Finance

CSFCA Position: Support
