Chief Dave Parmley serves as the fire chief for the Lake Dillon Fire Protection District in Summit County. The Lake Dillon FPD provides structural/wildland fire suppression, emergency medical services, heavy rescue and hazardous-materials services to the communities of Dillon, Frisco, Keystone, Montezuma, Summit Cove, Silverthorne and the unincorporated areas in Summit County along the I-70 corridor and Lower Blue River Valley.

Prior to the inclusion of the Snake River Fire Protection District into the Lake Dillon FPD in 2005, Parmley served for 24 years as the fire chief and district manager for the Snake River FPD.

As a Colorado native originally from Loveland, Chief Parmley has an Associate's Degree from Mesa State College and a Bachelor's Degree in Natural Resources Public Administration from Colorado State University. Parmley discovered his interest and passion for firefighting and EMS while working as a park ranger for the National Park Service at Glen Canyon National Recreation Area (Lake Powell).

Chief Parmley is the Immediate Past President of the Colorado State Fire Chiefs Association and represents the CSFCA on the Emergency Fire Fund Committee.
